

**NETTLETON SCHOOL DISTRICT
FEDERAL PROGRAMS ANNUAL REPORT
2020-2021**



Nettleton School District received federal support through several programs. The Title I, Part A of the Elementary and Secondary Education Act (ESEA) provides financial assistance to local educational agencies (LEAs) and schools with high numbers or high percentages of children from low-income families to help ensure that all children meet the challenging state academic standards. Title II is used to recruit, hire, improve, and retain highly qualified teachers and principals. Title IV is a grant for “well rounded education.” This grant is focused on Arts, Music, AP classes, Safety and other services that fall under Title I. Title V is a rural and low income grant that provides financial assistance in technology, parental involvement, professional development, recruitment and retention and activities authorized under Title I part A.

The Title 1 program has provided several teacher salaries, instructional supplies, benchmark assessment, homeless supplies, technology, interventionists and professional development. We received a total of \$344,366.00.

The Title II funds are used to hire consultant groups for professional development for teachers and administrators. These funds are also used for out of district professional development for teachers and administrators. We received a total of \$10, 817.00

The Title IV funds are used to help cover the cost of AP exams for students, with the remaining balance transferred to Title I. We received a total of \$24,453.00.

Title V funds will be used to provide upgraded technology to the District. We received a total of \$26,038.00.

A small portion of each grant goes into a consolidated cost pool to cover administrative costs.

We have seen a steady increase in student performance since 2015 and our district received a “C” rating for the 2019 school year. Also, all of our schools received a “C” rating with the Primary school receiving a “B” rating.
