

Federal Programs Annual Report

2018-2019



Nettleton School District received federal support through several programs. The Title I, Part A (**Title I**) of the Elementary and Secondary Education Act (ESEA) provides financial assistance to local educational agencies (LEAs) and schools with high numbers or high percentages of children from low-income families to help ensure that all children meet

the challenging state academic standards. **Title II** is used to recruit, hire, improve, and retain highly qualified teachers and principals. **Title IV** is a new grant for “well rounded education.” This grant is focused on Arts, Music, AP classes, Safety, and other services that fall under Title I. **Title V** is a rural and low income grant that provides financial assistance in technology, parental involvement, professional development, recruitment and retention, and activities authorized under Title I part A.

The **Title I** program has provided several teacher salaries, instructional supplies, benchmark assessments, homeless supplies, technology, interventionists, and professional development. We received a total of **\$338,011.00**.

- Primary *1 Interventionist salary *3 teacher assistant’s salary
- Upper Elementary *1 full time Math Interventionist and 1 full time Language Interventionist

The **Title II** funds are used to hire consultant groups for professional development for teachers and administrators. These funds are also used for out of district professional development for teachers and administrators. We received a total of **\$59,048.00**.

The **Title IV** funds are used to help cover the cost of AP exams for students, to purchase robotics equipment for our AP Computer Science and Exploring Computer Science classes, to purchase safety packs for every classroom in the district, and to purchase PBIS (Positive behavior program) materials. We received a total of **\$24,255.00**.

The **Title V** funds will be used to provide additional teacher trainings. We received a total of **\$23,657.00**.

A small portion of each grant goes into a consolidated cost pool to cover administrative costs.

We have seen a steady increase in student performance since 2015 and are proud to say that, our district received a “B” rating for the 2018 school year. Also, all of our schools received “B” ratings with the Primary school receiving an “A” rating.
